JEAN-LUC LAMBOLEY

Jean-Luc Lamboley is Professor of History and Archaeology of Ancient Worlds at the University “Pierre Mendès-France” of Grenoble, where he also serves as dean of the

Faculty of Human Sciences. He is promoter of the process of Bologna, Director of the French Epigraphical and Archaeological Mission in Albania (supported by the French Foreign Office), and Director of the European Research Group about the History and Archaeology of Balkans (supported by the French CNRS).
